What happens if a missing tooth is not replaced?



A missing tooth can lead to potential problems if not treated:


- Drifting and shifting of the surrounding teeth causing an unbalanced bite and compromising aesthetics.
- Increased biting stress on other teeth, possibly causing jaw pain.
- Bone loss in the area of the missing tooth, which may eventually require a bone graft.
- Losing your natural smile.



How can a missing tooth be replaced?

1. Removable Partial Denture(RPD):

An RPD attaches to your natural teeth with metal clasps or devices called precision attachments. This is an appliance that comes in and out of your mouth.



Removable Partial Denture

Drawbacks:

- ☐ Increased stress on the surrounding teeth.
- Must remove to clean after meals and keep out at night.
- Bone disintegration around the missing tooth.
- Sticky or hard foods can damage the denture.

2. Fixed Bridge:

A fixed bridge is a false tooth fused between two porcelain crowns to replace the missing tooth. It is a permanent fixture in your mouth. The adjacent teeth



Fixed Bridge


are reduced to support a 3-unit fixed bridge.

Drawbacks:

- Increased stress on the healthy teeth holding the bridge, possibly leading to breakdown over time.
- Prepared teeth may require root canal treatment.
- Cavities can occur on the supporting teeth.

3. Dental Implant:

A dental implant is an artificial tooth root made from titanium metal that a dentist places into your jaw to hold a replacement tooth or bridge. An implant is a permanent fixture in your mouth

that has excellent long- term success.

Dental implants provide a more advanced option for replacing a missing tooth than a removable partial denture or a fixed bridge. Implants also help to preserve the bone around them and eliminate the risk of dental decay.

Drawbacks:

- Involves a minor surgical procedure.
- Requires sufficient bone support.

Possible Restorations with Dental Implants

Implant Eligibility:

Dental implants can be placed in patients with fully developed jawbones, provided they have a sufficient quality and quantity of bone tissues available. Implants may <u>not</u> be suitable if the following situations are pre-existing:

- 1 Smoking
- 2 Uncontrolled diabetes
- **3** Uncontrolled osteoporosis
- 4 Active periodontal disease
- **5** Cardiovascular disease
- 6 Metal allergies
- 7 Nutritional deficiencies
- **8** History of bisphosphonate use
- 9 Severe bruxism or bite dysfunction
- **10** High consumption of alcohol
- **11** Immunocompromised condition
